Resolution to Oppose mRNA Vaccine Mandates in Public and Private Sectors

WHEREAS, Biden had no authority to impose mRNA vaccine mandates for private sector companies. It was an overreach by the Federal Government. (According to NBC News Online Dec 8, 2021, the US Senate passed a resolution to repeal Biden's mRNA vaccine mandate for private sector companies. Senator Mike Braun (Republican) who introduced the resolution argued that Biden had no authority to impose the requirements because it was an overreach by the Federal Government.)

WHEREAS, vaccine mandates by our government should have recognized exemptions for religious and medical exemption, based on the First Amendment, freedom of religion, and the Fourteenth Amendment, personal rights of privacy. (According to Trip Live Dec 28, 2022, 13 former Allegheny County employees are suing the county government after denying their requests for religious and medical exemptions. All 13 employees were fired for not getting the mRNA vaccine. even though religious and medical exemptions were requested. Now they are suing based on violation of their First and Fourteenth Amendments rights.)

WHEREAS, long-term safety data of the mRNA vaccines are not available and mRNA vaccines do not prevent the spread of COVID-19 (according to the current UC Davis Health/Coronavirus website).

WHEREAS, mRNA vaccines do have side effects, they were linked to cardiac deaths in young men. (documented in <u>Science.org</u> vol 378 Oct 17, 2022, the Florida Surgeon General Joseph Ladapo, advised men ages 18-39 to steer clear of the mRNA vaccines. The CDC reported the risk of myocarditis or pericarditis was about one in 6700 in 12-15-year-old boys following second dose and about one in 16,000 following the first booster. In 16-17-year-olds, 1 in 8,000 after 2nd dose and one in 6,000 after the first dose. Men ages 18-30 have a somewhat elevated risk as well.

Resolved, that the Nevada Federation of Republican Women call on all US elected officials to oppose mRNA vaccine mandates.
