
We organized three well-attended 2022 and 2023 Leadership meetings for both the northern and southern clubs for which we've received numerous compliments.



# BE READY TO VOTE

State Biennial Convention, October 20,21,22, of 2023

I encourage all our members to consider putting their name in the hat for one of these important positions; however, please ensure you are qualified for the position you seek as per our bylaws.

Please review:

Art IV Section 1. Qualifications.

- A. Each elected or appointed officer shall be an active member in good standing of a club. A member in good standing shall be one whose current dues have been paid in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws and those of their club and who is not under disciplinary action.
- B. To be eligible for the office of NvFRW President, a person shall have served at least two (2) years as President of a Nevada Federated Club or two (2) terms (4 years) on the Board of Directors of the NvFRW.
- C. To be eligible for the office of Treasurer, a person must have a minimal working knowledge of accounting and accounting software or a willingness and ability to learn how to use Quick Books or similar software.
- D. All other elected officers shall have served at least one (1) year as an elected officer of a club.

Thus, the officer must be an active member in good standing of a club, meaning their current dues have been paid per our state bylaws and their club's and are not under disciplinary action.

Special additional qualifications affect both the President and the Treasurer. The President must "have served at least two (2) years as President of a federated club or two terms on the Board of Directors." This means that they must have served from the January following their election through December of the year ending their two-year term.

Further, the Treasurer must have a "minimal" working knowledge of accounting and accounting software and a willingness and ability to learn how to use Quick Books or similar software.

### FROM THE PARLIMENTARIAN

#### AMENDING A MOTION

The motion to amend is used by a member who believes the amendment might improve the main motion being considered on the floor. It is a motion to modify the wording, and within certain limits the meaning, of a pending motion before it is voted upon.

The amendment's adoption does not adopt the motion thereby amended, the main motion remains pending in its modified form. A vote on the amendment is done first followed by a vote on the entire amended motion. Rejection of the motion to amend leaves the main motion worded as it was before the amendment was offered. (RONR, 2020, 12:4)

#### THREE BASIC TYPES OF AMENDMENT:

**To insert** (within) or add (at the end of a sentence or paragraph) a word, consecutive words, or paragraph.

**To strike out** a word, consecutive words, or a paragraph.

To strike out and insert a word, consecutive words, or a paragraph.

#### Example:

#### Main motion on the floor:

I move that the organization purchase a new computer desk for the office.

#### Amend by inserting words:

I move to amend the motion by inserting after 'desk' the words 'and chair'.

#### Amend by striking out words:


I move to amend the motion by striking out the word 'new'.

#### Amend by striking out and inserting the word:

I move to amend the motion by striking out the word 'new' and inserting the word 'used'.

It is extremely important for a presiding officer to clearly state the wording of the amendment, what the wording of the main motion will be if the amendment is adopted, and then again restate the amendment prior to the vote.

Proposed amendments need a second, are debatable, can be amended (see RONR, 2020 for



#### The question of a "friendly amendment":

Sometimes, when a motion is being debated, a member will offer a "friendly amendment" to the motion and the maker of the original motion will "accept" the amendment, and the presiding office will treat the motion as amended. This is not acceptable. Since the presiding officer has stated the motion, it is now the property of the assembly and that body must vote on the motion whether being amended or not.

I was "recruited soon after as club Secretary, a position I held under two Presidents before becoming President myself in 2013 and 2014. Thanks to my dedicated Board of Directors, we increased our participation in community events and, for the first time, sponsored candidate forums to promote Republican candidates to the citizens of Mesquite.

We were part of the statewide effort that turned Nevada RED in 2014. In 2020 and 2021, I served as club Treasurer, and in 2022 and in 2023, I was elected President again.

I have deep family roots in Essex County, Virginia, that date back to the 1700s. My husband, Kevin, and I lived and raised our family in San Diego starting in 1975 after we were sent there by the Navy. We moved to Mesquite full-time in 2012.

We like golfing and hiking and spend our summers in Steamboat Springs, Colorado. Before retiring in 2003, I was a software engineer and project lead for BAE Systems, formerly the Electronics Division of General Dynamics.

I am proud to serve MRW as President and stay focused on the club's mission to "inform" and "educate."

In 2022 we had our largest membership ever - 128 members, including associates! In 2022 we donated \$2,500 to Mesquite nonprofits and contributed over \$13,500 to the election of GOP candidates in the form of mailed slate cards, direct donations, and a GOP Field Office (that we finance and staff every election year). I am so grateful for

the generosity and enthusiasm of our membership, and the leadership and dedication of our Board of Directors.


